#### **Probation Department Holds Graduation Ceremony for Individuals Who Successfully Completed Their Adult Day Reporting Center Program**

Sacramento, CA – On November 13, 2014, the Sacramento County Probation Department will host its eleventh graduation ceremony for formerly incarcerated individuals who have successfully completed programming through the Adult Day Reporting Center (ADRC). There are three ADRCs in Sacramento County which provide resources and services to moderate and high-risk post-incarcerated individuals focused on successful reintegration into the community.

Since the inception of the program in 2010, the ADRCs have evolved into “one stop shops” which offer many on-site resources including a registered nurse, eligibility specialist, Wellness Counselors (Department of Health and Human Services), educational instructors, and individual and group counselors. Components of the program include victim restoration, community service, education, cognitive behavioral programming, vocational training, and job placement.

The ADRC program offers vocational training for eligible participants with the Northern California Construction Training (NCCT) Program. NCCT works closely with 22 local labor unions which assist with vocational training and employment placement. This nine-month commitment offers participants a chance to learn a variety of different trades and obtain a job in the construction industry. Participants learn an array of skills, including carpentry, cement work, electrical, plumbing, painting, landscaping, etc. Currently, there are 48 participants enrolled in this program. In 2014, twenty students graduated from the program and have successfully found jobs with local labor unions. 92 percent of our graduates have found jobs within the Sacramento region.

The Probation Department, along with representatives from provider-agencies Leaders in Community Alternatives and Strategies for Change, will honor 92 graduates from the ADRC program. Additionally, Sacramento County Office of Education and Elk Grove Adult Education will honor several individuals who successfully completed and will receive their General Educational Development (GED).
